Overview of presentation by presenters

The emphasis for this workshop is on non-pharmacological interventions for people living with dementia with the aim of minimising the functional impact of cognitive-communication difficulties and maximising engagement and quality of life. The Speech Pathologist's role in fostering functional communication and communication opportunities will be explored. A range of practical strategies will be showcased to promote meaningful interactions and connections between staff, families and older adults living with dementia, including communication boards, 'life story' books, iPads and group reminiscence activities. Case study examples of residents living in a high care residential facility will be used to demonstrate the various interventions.

Anyone interested in furthering their dementia knowledge, keeping up-to-date with recent research and networking with colleagues is welcome to attend.
